Intellectual Property Rights are the rights given to persons over the creations of their minds. They give the creator an exclusive right over the use of her creation for certain period of time.

Dr.P.V.Brahmachari in his deliberation he said that Intellectual Property is divided into two main streams. One area can be characterised as protection of Distinctive Science, in particular trade mark which stimulate and ensure fair competition and to protect consumers by enabling them to make informed choices between various goods and services.

Other type of Industrial Property is protected primarily to stimulate innovation, design and the creation of technology. It includes inventions, industrial designs and trade secrets.

He opined that the exclusive rights given are generally subject to a number of limitations and exceptions between the legitimate interest of right holders and of users.
