She explained that spoke that Human Rights Day is observed every year on 10 December remembering the day the United Nations General Assembly adopted, in 1988. The Universal Declaration of human rights was milestone document proclaiming the inalienable rights which everyone is inherently entitled to as a human being regardless of race, colour, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion. She also added that the rights of the child are specific rights to protect all young people under 18. Children are entitled to these rights to protect their made vulnerable position in society and to give passion special attention. A person younger than 18 years old is protected by human rights and children's' rights. Childern's rights are important because;— They recognize the right to meaningful participation of youth on politics and programmes that concern them, they make sure children can reason their full potential, by having access to education, health care, participation in society, have access to information to protect children from violence and abuse, and finally to ensure mutual respect, amongst children, but also within relations with adults, to develop respectful behavior and attitudes towards other.
